## Grading Policy for Grades 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>

Dear Parents,

Starting Monday, January 21, which is also the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter or second semester of school, all 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade teachers will be instituting a new uniform grading policy. Although the grading scales for letter grades have not changed (see scales below), our policies for Re-dos, late work and extra credit have. As always, we highly encourage you to check Parent Connect frequently to monitor your student's grades from home.

### Achievement

- A = 90 – 100% (outstanding work)
- B = 80 – 89% (above average work)
- C = 70 – 79% (average work)
- D = 60 – 69% (below average work)
- F = below 59% (failing work)

### Effort

- O = Outstanding
- S = Satisfactory
- N = Needs Improvement
- U = Unsatisfactory

4 <sup>th</sup> – 6 <sup>th</sup> Grade Policies for:

<p>Re-dos are available all year long on any test with a score below 70% (exception: 6<sup>th</sup> grade first semester only). Reteaching instruction will be provided for students, in class for concepts not mastered on the test. Students will then be given the opportunity to re-take that test in class. The recorded score in the grade book will be taken for the higher score with a maximum of 75% given.</p>	<p>Students' late work will be deducted by 10% overall within the first 4 days of it being turned in late. On day 5, the assignment will automatically be dropped to 50%.</p>	<p>No extra credit will be given at any time for any test, quiz, assignment, project, or presentation.</p>	<p>Reading- Test/Quizzes: 60% Homework 30% AR: 10%</p> <p>ELA- Tests/Quizzes: 70% Homework: 30%</p> <p>Math- Tests/Quizzes: 70% Homework: 30%</p> <p>Science- Test/Quizzes: 60% Homework: 40%</p> <p>Social Studies: Test/Quizzes: 60% Homework; 40%</p>

\*Our goal at Mountain View is to provide students in-class opportunities for maximum instruction in small group settings to ensure mastery of skills and concepts. As such, re-do support will occur during the school day at either morning or lunch recesses and/or during class time. To keep you informed of failing tests/quizzes, a parent grading notification slip will be sent home with your child's test grade. After the student has retaken the test, both tests will be sent home for your review so that you can see the grade improvement.
