Facility Cleaning

WHAT CAN I EXPECT... CLEANING AND DISINFECTING

SCHEDULED CLEANING ON A TYPICAL SCHOOL DAY				
Before School	Mid Morning	After Lunch	Afternoon	After School Ends
				
Disinfecting stations and supplies for classrooms stocked for the day.	Disinfect all high-touch campus surfaces (door handles, countertops, etc.), bathrooms and administrative areas.	Disinfect Multipurpose Rooms, bathrooms and high-touch campus surfaces (door handles, countertops, etc.), bathrooms and administrative areas.	Disinfect all high-touch campus surfaces (door handles, countertops, etc.), bathrooms and administrative areas.	Deep disinfection of all classrooms, bathrooms and administrative areas using electrostatic backpack sprayers.



Schools will be **cleaned four times a day** using a disinfectant approved by the EPA that kills COVID.

- High-use surfaces will be cleaned regularly by **custodians**, and classrooms and offices will be fogged with a deep disinfectant treatment each evening.
- **Teachers** will be provided hand sanitizer and disinfectant for their classrooms.
- **Anyone** entering a classroom will be required to sanitize his or her hands.
- Desks and any shared classroom surfaces that **students** use will be disinfected by the teacher as needed.
- Bathrooms will be disinfected multiple times a day, and soap and paper towels will be replenished regularly. All **students** are expected to wash their hands after using the restroom.



COVID RESPONSE TEAM

The district has a special, on-call team trained on disinfecting practices as dictated by CDC should a student/staff member get sick in a classroom or test positive for COVID.

Disinfecting Details

Clovis Unified is using Oxivir, a hydrogen-peroxide-based disinfectant listed by the EPA as a COVID-killing product. It is safe around people and in the EPA's lowest level of hazard. Oxivir will be used at its virucidal concentration on a regular basis. The COVID Response Team would follow CDC safety protection protocols and use it at a higher concentration **in the event of an illness or positive COVID case** in a classroom.



Student/Staff Health Screenings and Requirements

WHAT CAN I EXPECT... HEALTH SCREENINGS

In order to keep students and staff healthy, some things will look a bit different as we layer in extra health, sanitizing and hygiene steps into the school day.



If a child exhibits COVID symptoms

While at home...

Keep your child home if they have:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

While at school...

- Student will be **moved to a sick child room** until parent/guardian can pick them up.
- Students in the sick child room will be **masked and socially distanced** while supervised by CUSD staff.
- Staff **with appropriate PPE** will be available to evaluate and assist students.
- The sick child room will be **cleaned and disinfected** after symptomatic student leaves.
- Student to remain home for **10 days** after showing symptoms AND after they have been fever-free for **24 hours**, without the use of fever-reducing medications.
- Student OK to return to school sooner **If negative COVID test AND symptoms have resolved** for at least 24 hours without the use of medication.
- Students living in the same household with a student presenting with symptoms and/or testing positive for COVID to remain out of school for **14 days** from last exposure and/or until such time as the student with symptoms is confirmed to be COVID negative and **symptom free**.

Transportation

WHAT CAN I EXPECT... TRANSPORTATION

Safely delivering students to and from school remains the Transportation Team's No. 1 priority.



If possible, **families are encouraged to make their own transportation arrangements** for their students to limit the number of students riding school buses. For those needing to use the district's optional bus service, reducing risk for students and drivers will require:

- Disinfecting bus surfaces and seats between routes
- Windows open, weather permitting
- Drivers wearing PPE equipment
- Passengers using provided hand sanitizer upon entering bus
- All students wearing face coverings
- Bus filled from back to front or as needed by bus stop location
- Social distancing to extent possible

On-Site Learning Student Drop Off/Campus Procedures

- Every student will be asked if they have completed their self-screening and have their temperature taken before going to their classroom. If they have a temperature of 100 degrees F or greater, they will not be allowed to go to class and will be sent home.
- Our TK-6th grade students will be required to wear a face mask/covering the entire time they are on campus/in class. Mask breaks will be provided.
- Students will be required to wash and/or sanitize their hands before entering the classroom and will be encouraged to frequently wash hands and sanitize while on campus/in class.
- Physical distancing of at least 6 feet will be implemented while on campus and in the classroom at all times.

Procedures if a Student Develops COVID Like Symptoms While at School

- The following procedures will be used with any student exhibiting or complaining of any of the COVID like symptoms.
- Student will be taken to the identified care area, with separate entrance, until transported home or, if needed, to higher level of care. More than one student may be placed in sick care area if all are masked and socially distanced.
- Student will remain at home for 10 days. If symptoms persist beyond 10 days, they will remain at home until 24 hours after they are symptoms free without the use of medication. Student can return to school sooner if a COVID test is negative AND symptoms have resolved for at least 24 hours without the use of medication.
- If the student has siblings in Clovis Unified, the siblings will also be required to be sent home at the time of their sibling with COVID like symptoms being picked up. All members of the household will not be allowed to return to school for 14 days from the last contact with the student with COVID like symptoms. Household members could return earlier if the student with COVID like symptoms takes a COVID test with negative results AND the household members have not developed COVID like symptoms.

The symptoms of COVID-19 are similar in adults and children and can look like other common illnesses, like colds, strep throat, or allergies. The most common symptoms of COVID-19 in children are fever and cough, but children may have any of these signs or symptoms of COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Nasal congestion or runny nose
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Diarrhea
- Nausea or vomiting
- Tiredness
- Headache
- Muscle or body aches
- Chest tightness/pain

Student Feels Ill With COVID-19 Symptoms, but Parent/Guardian Will NOT Be Testing Their Child

- The same procedures will be used as with any student exhibiting or complaining of any of the COVID like symptoms, which were detailed on the previous slide, then the following procedures will take place.
- The student will remain at home for 10 days. The 10 days begins on the day the symptoms began. If symptoms persist beyond 10 days, student will remain at home until at least 1 day after symptoms have resolved without the use of medication.
- If the COVID like symptoms are detected at home and the student is kept home, the classroom teacher will be notified about their symptomatic student and will monitor the class to determine if classmates or he/she begin exhibiting or complaining of any of the COVID like symptoms.

Pros and Cons

▶ In-Person Hybrid Schedule *

▶ Potential Drawbacks:

- ▶ Childcare for ½ day
- ▶ More independent work/practice
- ▶ Teacher Change may occur
- ▶ Access to instruction with illness/quarantine
- ▶ Less overall direct instruction minutes per week

▶ Potential Benefits:

- ▶ Engaged in-person with teacher
- ▶ Social-Emotional Support and connection with site outside of zoom
- ▶ Increased ability for student feedback and paper/pencil work
- ▶ Daily Contact with Teacher (Wednesday whole class zoom)

▶ Clovis Connect (Virtual Scheduled On-Line)

▶ Potential Drawbacks:

- ▶ No in-person instruction
- ▶ Teacher change may still occur depending on master schedule needs
- ▶ Current issues with this instructional model may not be resolved
- ▶ Challenge for teacher/student feedback
- ▶ Childcare issues

▶ Potential Benefits:

- ▶ More direct instruction minutes per week with teacher
- ▶ No change to current learning model for students
- ▶ Access to instruction even through illness/quarantine
- ▶ Daily Contact with Teacher (virtually)

Co-Curricular/On-Site Activities

- ▶ Plan is being developed to be able to resume on-site co-curricular activities in alignment with the Fresno County Department of Public Health’s “Return to Play” guidelines.
- ▶ Current plan is to resume shortened athletic seasons beginning in January with the possibility of intramural style activities being offered in November/December.
- ▶ Classroom Music/Band/Choir/Orchestra
- ▶ Other non-athletic co-curriculars (Drama/Robotics/Etc.)

Parent Survey

- ▶ All families will complete a survey (being sent out tomorrow after 5:00 pm) noting the learning option you prefer for your child once students can return to onsite instruction. A copy of the schedules, health and safety guidelines, and other details of in-person instruction will be emailed to parents at the end of the week
- ▶ Additional question will be included for parent input regarding potentially waiting to make any changes until 2nd semester (January 18th)
- ▶ Once the Parent Survey window closes a new master schedule will be created using the updated learning option choices received.
- ▶ When creating the new master schedule, many things will need to be considered in order to meet the CDC guidelines, which could include teacher changes to balance class sizes.
- ▶ Once the master scheduled is finalized you will receive a message from your child's classroom teacher welcoming them to their class.
- ▶ On Monday, October 12th there will be a Zoom Parent Town Hall meeting. You will receive a Zoom invitation and a link to submit questions that you have regarding returning to campus. If you are not able to commit to the date or time it is scheduled, it will be recorded so you can watch at your convenience.
