This student will represent our school at all Student Leadership meetings, and will work with Mrs. Gustafson, Mrs. Snyder, and Mrs. Moorhead to schedule book readings to classes on campus.

Public Relations Directors: (4th, 5th, & 6th grade) 2 person position

The Public Relations Director will lead a small group of student council members to Welcome, greet, and arrange a tour of the school for new students and special Guests.
