Review and Approve Minutes

The minutes from the September 11, 2018 meeting were approved.

In the Know – Barry Jager

Barry shared the opportunity to reflect and have a moment of silence for the passing of several teachers and former staff of CUSD.

Hiring update – The DP posting for CWHS will be released soon, in addition, we will also kick off the Principal positions that will be hired out of our pools that are closing soon.

For the current year we have 142 teacher hires and we currently have 15 openings. For Classified we have had 99 hires with 45 current open positions.

CLASSIII Cultural Proficiency – a lot of work has been conducted to create a document that is aligned with our Districts three aims. Now our classified departments and employees will be involved to gain and hear their insights and be aware of our cultural needs and how we can engage with one another. CUBSS will be involved as we move forward.

There has been a districtwide special education roadmap created to ensure we are hearing where we need to provide additional support. We are creating new job descriptions, changes with transportation, providing additional training for IA's and teachers.
