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

TIPS & TAKEAWAYS

MENTOR/COACH

Induction Mentor is synonymous with the name instructional coach. **Jim Knight**, a leading expert on instructional coaching and teacher professional learning believes, "An instructional coach must be an expert in building relationships...Finding common ground is an important habit to adopt so that we can have better conversations. When we find common ground, we move beyond our differences, and we communicate that we truly see someone else." Being mindful of this thought we aim to develop effective lines of communication.

PARTICIPATING TEACHER (PT)

In our fall edition, we focused on the four criteria of effective feedback and the impact it has on student learning. Effective feedback must be accurate, fair, specific, and timely. In addition, "for feedback to be received and have a positive effect, we need transparent and challenging goals - learning intentions" (Hattie, 2012). Learning intentions focus on establishing an understanding between teacher and student about what students will learn and how they will learn it.

THINKIFIC

Thinkific is a platform that provides the space for individuals to engage in professional learning through the completion of online courses. These self-paced courses are created by our program's mentors and offer participating teachers (PTs) the opportunity to cultivate their own professional development. Courses are aligned with CSTPs and can support a PT's individual learning plan (ILP). The program highly encourages PTs to use the course offerings as research sources for their "Inquiry Research and Analysis" this semester.

The program expectation for PTs is to complete two courses for the spring semester by **May 1, 2024** (Portfolio Check #6).
