Special Programs

Center for Advanced Research and Technology (CART) - Provides a 75,000 square foot state-of-the-art research and technology facility where students design and complete projects in collaboration with partners from the local, national, and international business communities.

Career Technical Education (CTE)/Regional occupational Program (ROP) - Prepares students for further education at colleges and universities, employment, or advanced technical training.

Community College Classes & Dual Enrollment - In collaboration with State Center Community College District (SCCCD), Clovis East offers several opportunities for students to earn college credits.

School and Community Facts

Clovis East High School opened with its first class in 1999. We are a comprehensive public high school serving grades nine through twelve. The school offers rigorous academic programs which include Advanced Placement, Honors, support courses in language arts and math, California Technical Education (CTE) career courses, special needs offerings in RSP and SDC, and a successful English Learner program. We are proud of our student engagement beyond the classroom where our students compete in 16 Varsity sports, a nationally successful Agriculture program, 67 clubs, a Peer Counseling program, and successful Performing Arts and Band programs.

Located in Clovis, California, a suburban community of 120,124 in Central California's San Joaquin Valley, we are adjacent to Fresno, CA which has a metropolitan population of 1,008,654. Our ethnically diverse school's student body mirrors our community which is 42% Hispanic/Latino, 21% White, 19% Southeast Asian, 4% Asian-Indian, 5% Filipino, 4% African-American, and 5% other. 51% of our student population is considered socio-economically disadvantaged. We have 106 English Language Learners, and many of our students will be first generation college attendees. Of the Class of 2022, 33% matriculated to four year universities, 49% matriculated to community colleges, 2% joined the military, and 16% joined the workforce.

The mission of the Reagan Educational Center, which serves Clovis East High School and Reyburn Intermediate School, is to graduate students who possess the background knowledge, academic skills, and technological expertise that they will need to become life-long learners, productive workers, and civic-minded community members. We also believe that participation in school activities builds stronger relationships, improves self-esteem, and develops the skills students need to prepare them to meet future challenges in college and the workforce.

Graduation Requirements

Clovis East students must earn 95% of attempted credits taken throughout their high school careers in order to graduate. The typical student class load is six classes for a total of 240 credits, of which 230 are required to graduate.

Clovis East High School is on a semester schedule where students attend two eighteen-week terms each year (Fall and Spring). Each semester consists of three six-week grading periods.

Schedule

Clovis East has six period regular scheduled days on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday. Wednesdays (even) and Thursdays (odd) are block scheduled days allowing teachers additional time in the curriculum with students. Most classes are yearlong with the exception of a few semester courses such as Government, Economics, Health, American Cultures, College & Career Readiness, Psychology, and Sociology.

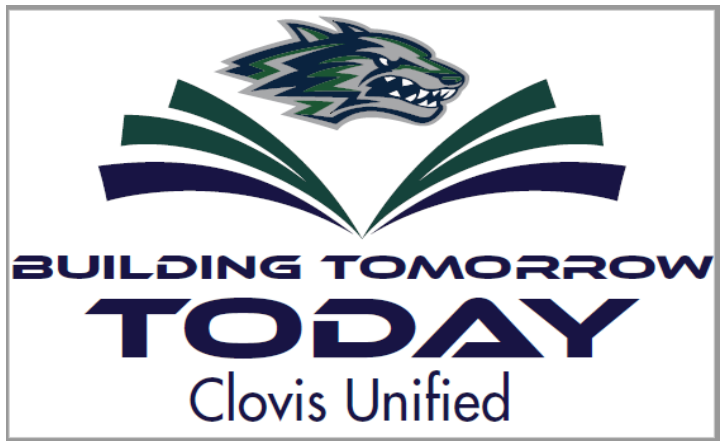
Honors Courses
