COLLEGE OPTIONS & REQUIREMENTS

PREPARATION FOR COLLEGE

1 Grades

- Earning C's or better help students meet the minimum GPA of a 3.0 for applying to a 4 year university
- Additionally, grades are used as prerequisites for entrance into other high courses

3 Behavior

- Make connections with your teachers for future letters of recommendation
- Follow the Code of the North and have good character

2 Extra Curricular

- Sports, Clubs and Volunteer hours help students add value to their college applications, proving their worth to his or her

4 Testing

- Performance on AP Exams as well as **SAT** and or **ACT** testing may be used to evaluate a student in college admissions
 - Take spring of junior year or summer going into senior year
- UC/CSUs are not accepting SAT/ACT scores currently

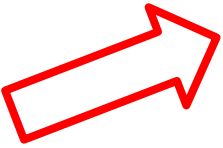

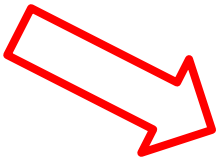

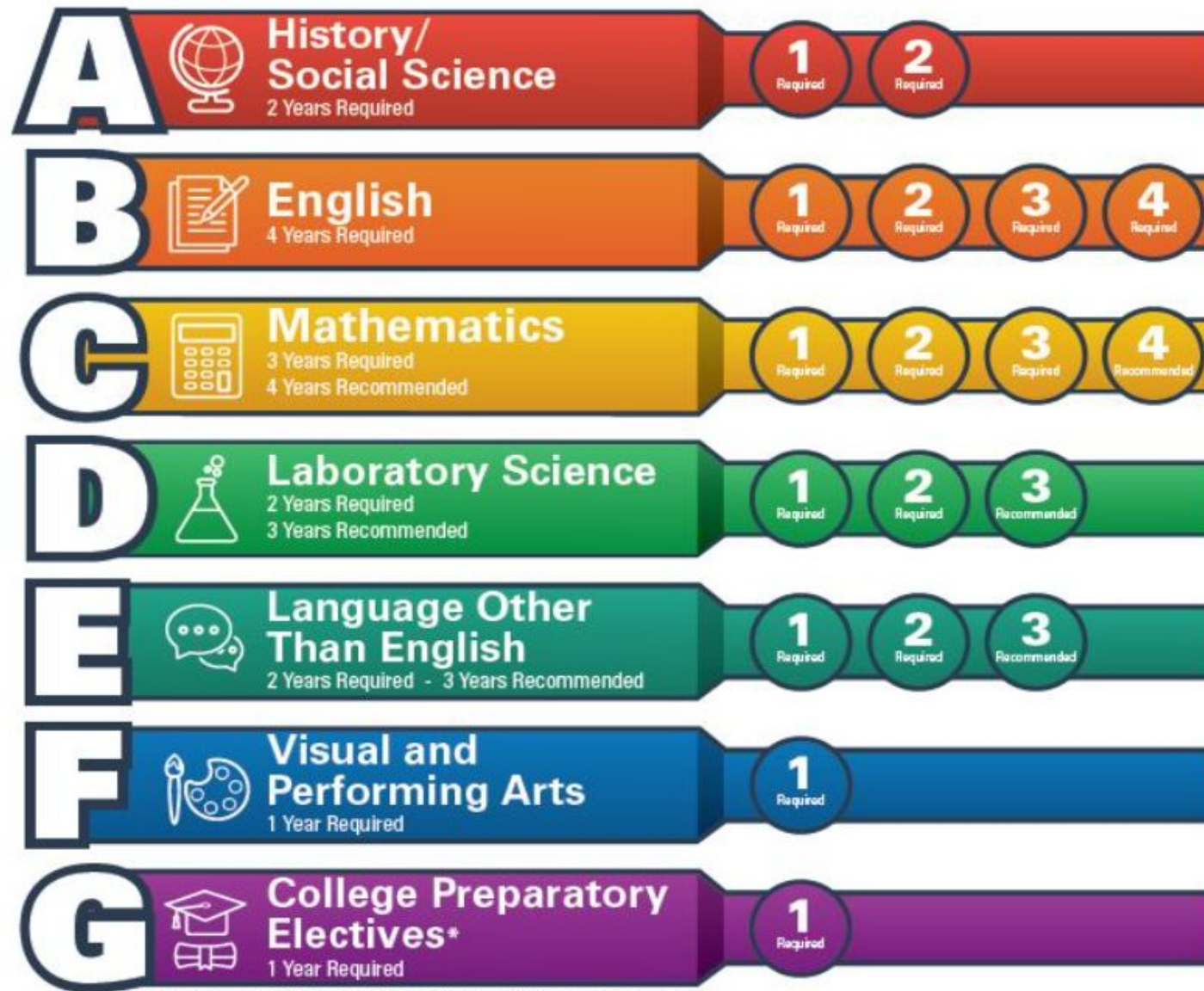


FOUR YEAR UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS:

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A FOUR YEAR
UNIVERSITY YOU MUST:

- Meet the A-G Course Requirements
- Earn a C or better in all courses
 - 2.5 GPA to apply to CSU
 - 3.0 GPA to apply to UC
- Research admissions testing requirements
- CSU-SAT Currently NOT required

Interested in AP (Advanced Placement) Courses?

As you begin planning your course offerings for the next school year, remember that:



Research shows that students who take AP[®] courses and exams have better college outcomes than their peers who don't take AP.



Exposure to college-level material and early encouragement to plan for college are vital in raising students' expectations and building their confidence.



Half of students entering four-year colleges are now starting school with some credit from AP courses.

Unitrack

The Uni-Track Program at Fresno State allows dual enrollment for high school students, who can earn college credits while enrolled in an approved Uni-Track course.

Who can Participate? Any junior or senior student who is enrolled in certain sections of:

- AP US History (History 11, History 12)
- AP Government (Political Sci 2)
- AP Macro/Microeconomics (Econ 50, Econ 40)
- AP Calculus AB (Math 75)
- AP Calculus BC (Math 76)
- AP Spanish (Spanish 1A)
- Specific CTE and CART classes

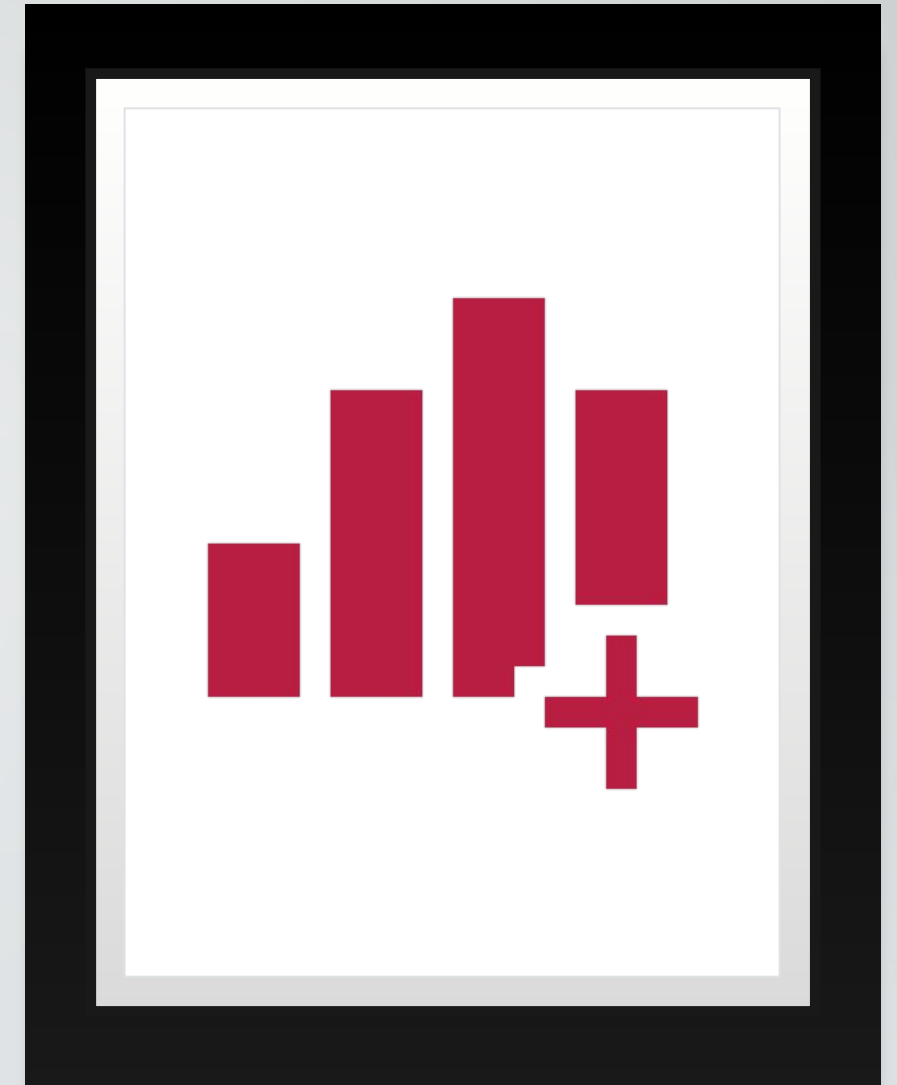

HONORS AND AWARDS RECOGNIZED AT GRADUATION

- **CSF LIFETIME MEMBER:** Eligible students become members of CSF by submitting applications based on their report card grades. Membership is for one semester, and student must apply by the deadline. To become a **LIFETIME MEMBER**, seniors must be members for four of the last six semesters of high school, one of which is in their senior year. <https://cnec.cusd.com/CSF.aspx>
- **NATIONAL HONORS SOCIETY (NHS):** NHS is a nationwide organization for high school. Students must submit an application in October. Selection is based on four criteria: scholarship, leadership, service, and character <https://cnec.cusd.com/NHS.aspx>
- **VALEDICTORIAN:** The Valedictorian(s) Award will be given to all graduates who earn straight A's in their first seven semesters.
- **SALUTATORIAN:** The Salutatorian(s) Award will be given to all graduating seniors who have earned all A's and one B in seven semesters. A student who substitutes a grade by repeating a course **will not** qualify for the Salutatorian or Valedictorian Award.

HONORS AND AWARDS RECOGNIZED AT GRADUATION

- **ACADEMIC SCHOLARS OF DISTINCTION:** Students who complete a minimum of five (5) advanced placement courses and earn at least at 4.15 grade point average on the UC/CSU weighted grading system will be introduced at the graduation ceremony.
- **CALIFORNIA SEAL OF BILITERACY:** To qualify student must complete all ELA requirements for graduation with a 2.0 in those classes, pass the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress for English language arts, or any successor test, administered in grade eleven, at or above the “standard met” achievement level, or at the achievement level determined by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction (SSPI) for any successor test, and demonstrate proficiency in one or more language in addition to English, demonstrated through one of the following methods:
 - Pass a foreign language AP exam with a score of 3 or higher
 - Complete a four-year high school course of study in a world language and attainment of an overall GPA of 3.0 or above in that course of study
 - Pass the SAT II Subject Foreign Language Examination with a 600 or higher
